TREASURERS REPORT: Balance as of 8/31/30: \$7,367.05

GUEST SPEAKER: Bill Houck, Associated Posters

Bill Houck discussed options for the material to be used for neighborhood signs. The existing signs are not set in concrete, posts are wood, signs are polywood. No decisions were made on the signage. Signs will be set at 7 maybe 8 locations. The City of Roanoke approved the sign at Grandin and Mud Lick. GDNA may start with several sign replacements in 2021 and replace several signs over a three-year period. We need to reach out to the city to see where grant money has been spent.

NEW BUSINESS: Storm water project on Eaton almost completed. Concern about trees planted close to powerlines. Discussed the placement of two streetlights on Mud Lick as the street is very dark at night. Mike Dame announced he will not be renewing his position as President of GDNA in January 2021.
