GREATER DEYERLE NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION MINUTES

This was a virtual meeting.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Balance as of 10/31/2020: \$7,367.05. All bills are paid.

GUEST SPEAKER: Joseph Arthur- City of Roanoke, Acting Stormwater Utility Manager

Greenlee Road Project-Lakecrest Court

Reviewed map detailing ditches and guardrails. Trees should not grow above 12 feet and should not interfere with the powerlines. This project should close out on November 20, 2020.

There was a concern about flooding over the bridge on Crestmoor, about fifty feet before the bridge. Flooding occurs between 302-312 Crestmoor. Joseph Arthur said there may be an issue correcting this problem due to the utilities.

Windsor Project: Storm water culvert is being installed from Deyerle Road, below CPC through backyards of homes on Chesterton, next to the Ripley's pool, across Mud Lick behind WHM parking lot and ending up behind homes on Windsor Road. The Deyerle section is complete and work is starting in the Mud Lick area. Neighbors on Chesterton are still reporting water overflowing on Deyerle less than two weeks ago. Neighbors addressed the issue that they were informed manhole covers would have grates in them, but they do not. The old culverts still have water running through them. There are still issues which need to be addressed. Residents were paid for easements.

Brymoor Road Project to begin soon.

Neighbors inquired when projects would be completed. Joseph Arthur said there were over 220 projects in the city with a cost of \$190 million that would take 75 years to complete.
