Brandon Station Townhouse Community



This **November 4th is the 40th anniversary of the Flood of 1985**. For many Roanoke residents, the Flood of 1985 was an unforgettable event that made clear the potential for flooding to impact people's lives and change communities forever. The City of Roanoke and the Stormwater Division have collected stories from those that experienced the flood. Neighbors, strangers, and friends looking out for each other.
